

How to prepare for a compliance audit

The Immigration and Customs Enforcement (ICE) is the largest investigative agency of the U.S. Department of Homeland Security, and they can initiate an audit called a Notice of Inspection (NOI) Audit. This formal review examines an employer's Form I-9 records to ensure compliance with the Immigration Reform and Control Act (IRCA) and confirm that employees are authorized to work in the U.S.

Here are a few things to keep in mind to prepare for a potential review:

Do your employees know where the Form I-9s are stored?		
Are Form I-9s stored securely and easily accessible?		
Do you conduct proactive, internal reviews to identify and correct any errors, omissions, or compliance risks		
Have you confirmed documentation for completeness and accuracy including identifying missing signatures, incorrect dates or invalid documents?		
Are payroll records, employee rosters and other documents easily located in the event of an audit?
